Egyptian lawyers move to overturn Sisi's support for Nile dam project

A group of Egyptian lawyers and political activists are preparing a lawsuit to challenge a March 2015 preliminary deal agreed by Egyptian President Adbel Fattah al-Sisi on Ethiopia's Nile dam project, reported local media on Wednesday. The deal signed by President Sisi, Ethiopian Prime Minister Hailemariam Desalegn, and Sudanese President Omar al-Bashir, asserted Ethiopia's right to build the Grand Ethiopian Renaissance Dam (GERD), a decision that has caused huge concerns in Egypt over its water supply and ability to generate hydro-electric power. http://bit.ly/2iCH90e
